When the wind blew.....

Despite the very severe storms at the end of October, the trees in the town's parks fared extremely well with only a few trees and tree limbs becoming casualties of this extreme weather. However to ensure that the Town's woodlands remain healthy, the Town Council has undertaken a Tree and Woodland Management Survey to assess the condition of the trees and woodland areas. With 5 parks and a cemetery, there will always be on going arboricultural work required, but during the next 18 months the Town Council has set aside money to undertake the higher priority works.
